## MJQF HISTORY

Cambodian Institute of Child and Adolescent Health (CICAH) is a local non-governmental organization that aimed to provide health-related information and services to vulnerable youth, children and mothers in Phnom Penh. Cambodian Institute of Child and Adolescent Health was established under the initiative of Oknha Dr. Mengly J. Quach in 2004 in order to promote education amongst vulnerable children through scholarships.

Since its establishment, CICAH had developed with clear goals and objectives in order to improve the health of children in Cambodia. There were some programs were initiated within the organization for building collaboration and relationships with local NGOs that are active on health and education sectors.

## MJQF HISTORY CON'T

The main goal is to promote knowledge and to provide services that help eliminating life-threatening diseases, promoting healthy living, and developing the spirit of valuing and optimizing the vulnerability of youth. Thus, it makes young people to be able to promote their full potential. So, only the promotion of education and the right to access resources will make these vulnerable youth develop their knowledge and lead to better future.

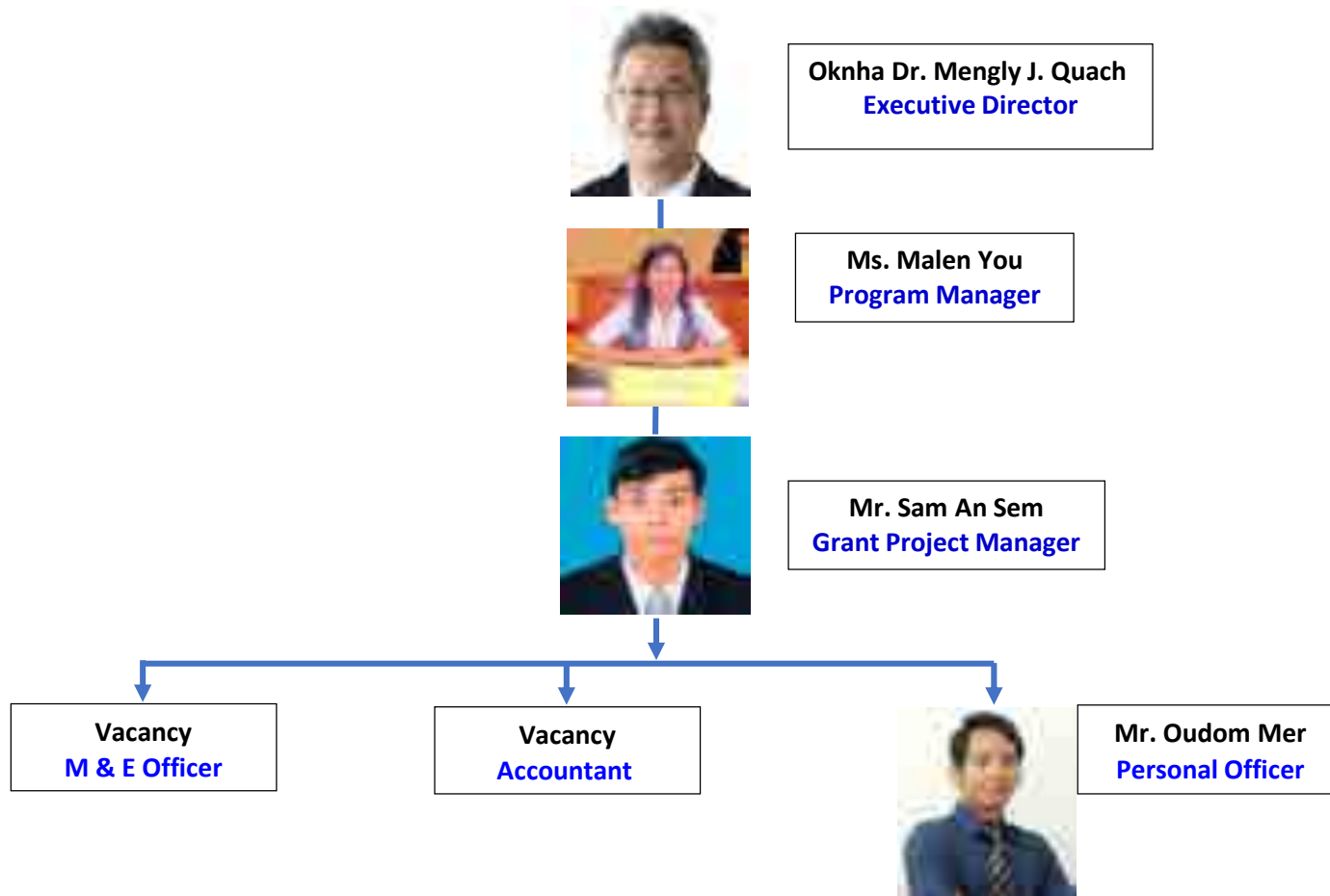

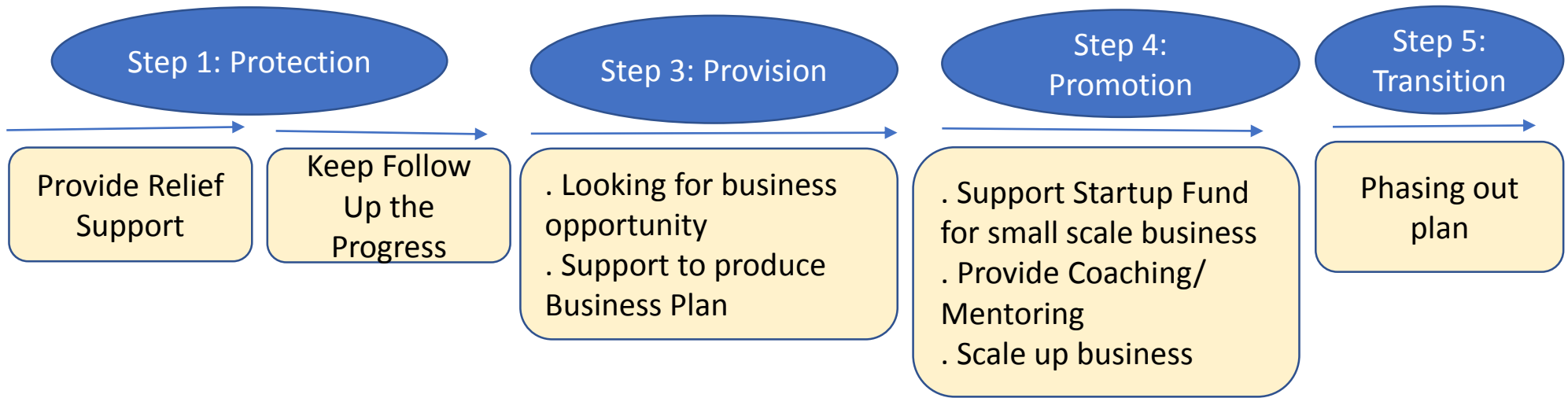

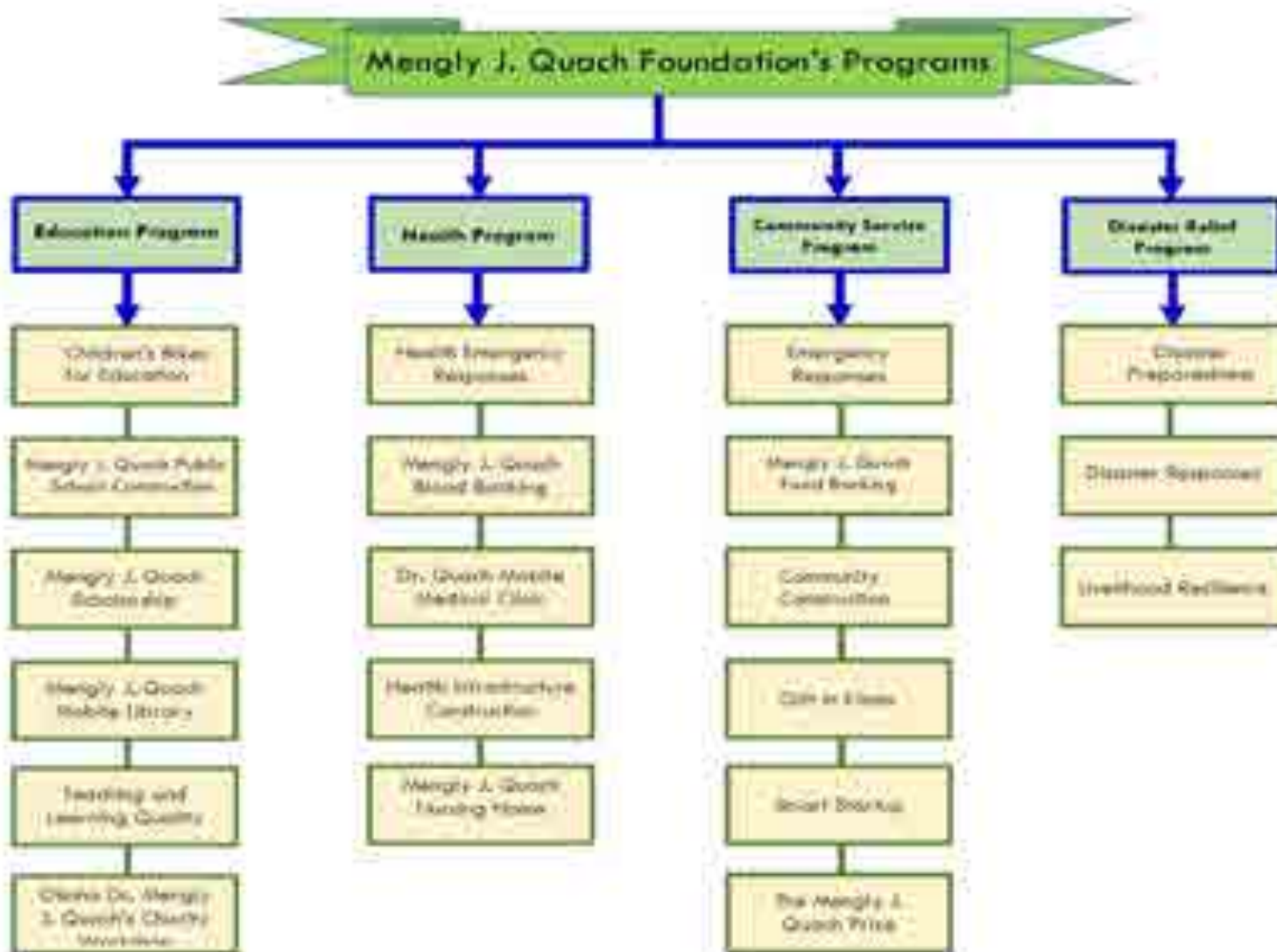
# MJQF ORGANIZATION CHART



# MJQF KEY APPROACHES



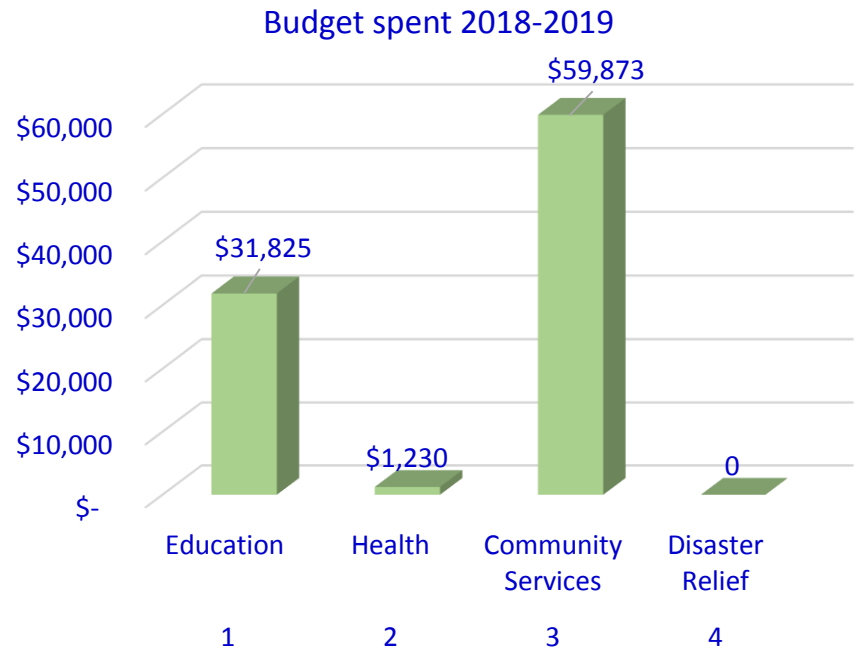
# MJQF LOGICAL FRAMEWORK

# Challenges

1. Lack of staff for implementing project activity
2. Too many requests from poor family and community
3. Limited funding sources (MJQE, Mr. Chairman's family, Charity) not able to response the actual need of community
4. Not clear flow of Annual Report submission to government
5. To revise bylaw of MJQF required lots of documents by Mol
6. Not clear what difference between an organization and CSR
7. Lack of partnership with NGO partner and other agencies

## The expectation as a member of CCC

1. Seek support from CCC to build network with other NGOs and agencies among CCC member for enhancing MJQF activities
2. CCC should introduce MJQF to donor or funding sources institution for fundraising opportunity or proposal call
3. Join proposal development with other NGO member of CCC for finding extra funding source
4. CCC should advice or introduce MJQF to relevant ministries of government for gaining support and accelerate the process changing bylaw and other necessary tasks

# Planning

1. Follow up the progress of revise bylaw with Mol
2. Looking for fundraising opportunity through proposal development of joining proposal with other NGO
3. Partnership with other NGOs that work the same sector to reduce the amount of budget spend and build reputation
4. Conduct fundraising among MJQE suppliers
5. Conduct Food Banking and Bike for Education to 300 vulnerable families at Sensok, Phnom Penh
6. Facilitate Charity Workshop at Kampong Cham province
7. Follow the progress of 03 target schools for changing name and identify next action to be taken
8. Continue to support sick person who required monthly support
9. Support scholarship to orphan children who's their parent were dead by building collapsed at Kampong Som province
10. Conduct 2 times of Food Banking/month to orphanage center/NGO
