on the 4th Monitoring of Global Partnership for Effective Development Cooperation (GPEDC) Monitoring Exercise in Cambodia: the CSO Enabling Assessment in Cambodia

17th September 2024

2:00PM – 4:00PM

Introduction:

The **Global Partnership for Effective Development Cooperation** was established in 2011 by 163 countries in Busan, Republic of Korea, as a multi-stakeholder platform that aims to advance the effectiveness of all development efforts and contribute to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The partnership fosters engagement and mutual learning on how to make development co-operation more effective, country-owned, results-oriented, inclusive, transparent, and accountable.

The monitoring exercise is the Global Partnership's flagship instrument to track the implementation of Effective Development Co-operation commitments, aimed at implementing the four development effectiveness principles – country ownership, a focus on development results, inclusive partnerships, and enhancing transparency and mutual accountability. Since 2011, there have been three monitoring rounds, and 99 partner country governments have participated, together with their development partners and other development actors.

Country-specific results of the monitoring exercise, along with global aggregates, provide key evidence through which partners can identify strengths and opportunities and guide dialogue and action to maximize the impact of their work. The monitoring exercise also contributes to the SDG follow-up and review process by generating data for SDG 17 and SDG 5 and helping countries assess *how effectively* all actors work together to support national development priorities and development results.

A comprehensive reform of the monitoring exercise took place between 2020 and 2022, culminating in a revised monitoring process and framework. It was endorsed at the 3rd Global Partnership High-Level Meeting in 2022, also known as the Effective Development Co-operation Summit. The Summit also launched the 4th monitoring round, which will take place from 2023 to 2026, at the end of which the next High-Level Meeting is expected to be held.

Cooperation Committee for Cambodia (CCC) has been invited by Council for Development of Cambodia (CDC) for the 4th Monitoring of GPEDC Monitoring Exercise in Cambodia in 2024. With this engagement, CCC has a space to provide inputs from CSOs on the Monitoring Exercise: Assessment of CSO Enabling Environment and Development Effectiveness that focuses on four modules:

1. Space for CSO dialogue on national development policies
2. CSO development effectiveness: Accountability and Transparency
3. Development cooperation with CSOs

4. Legal and regulatory framework

The CSOs inputs collection will be consolidated and finalized before 30 September 2024. . CCC will submit all the inputs into the online system organized by CDC. . A meeting on the 4th Monitoring of GPEC was conducted with CCC members on 5th September with less than 10 participated organizations. Therefore, CCC would like to call for another online meeting on 17th September 2024 from 2:00pm – 4:00pm.
