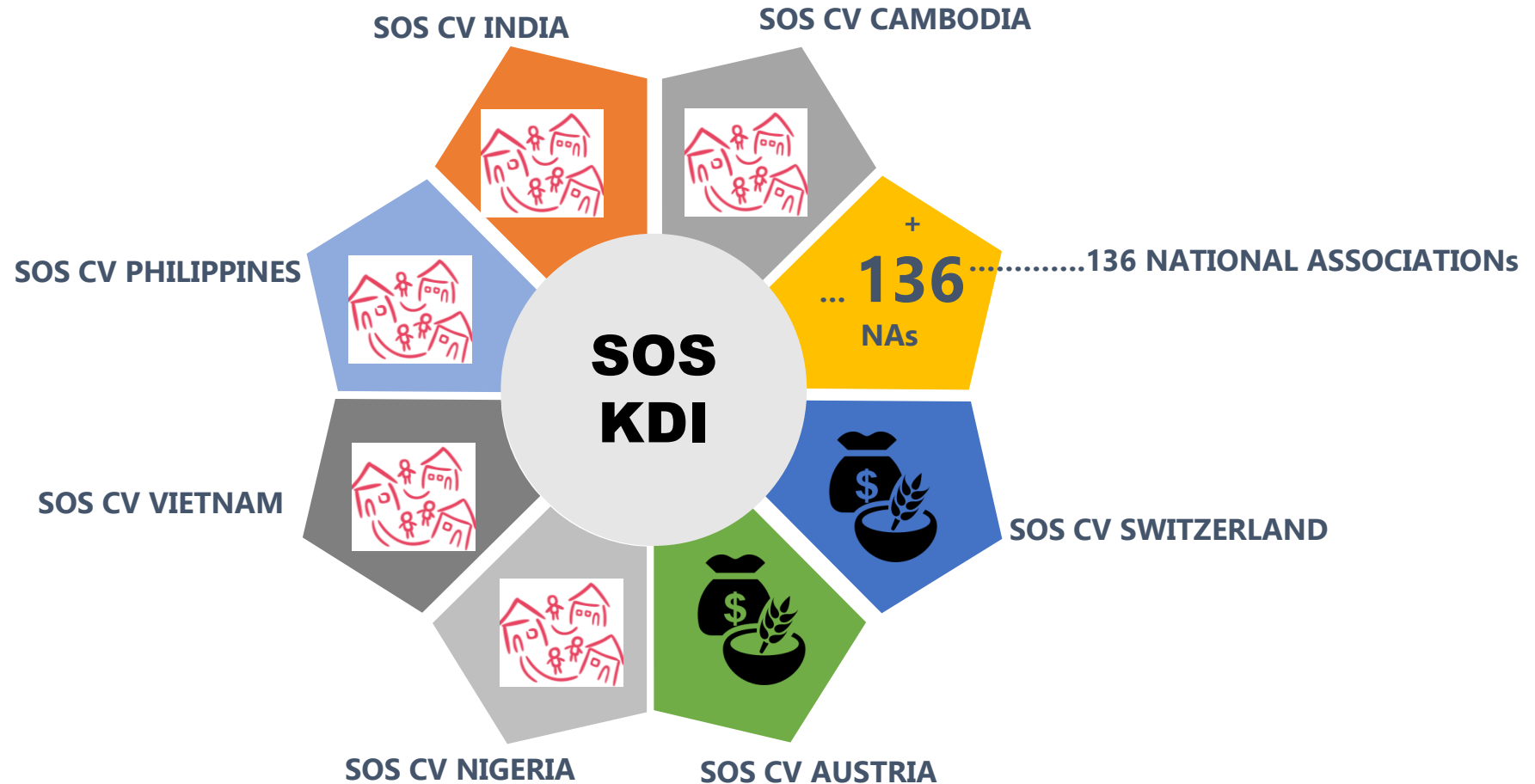

Roots of SOS Children's Village

The first SOS Children's Village was founded by Hermann Gmeiner in 1949 in Imst, Austria. He was committed to helping children in need – children who had lost their homes, their security and their families as a result of the Second World War. With the support of many donors and co-workers, our organisation has grown to help children all over the world.

We respect varying religions and cultures, and we work in countries and communities where our mission can contribute to development. 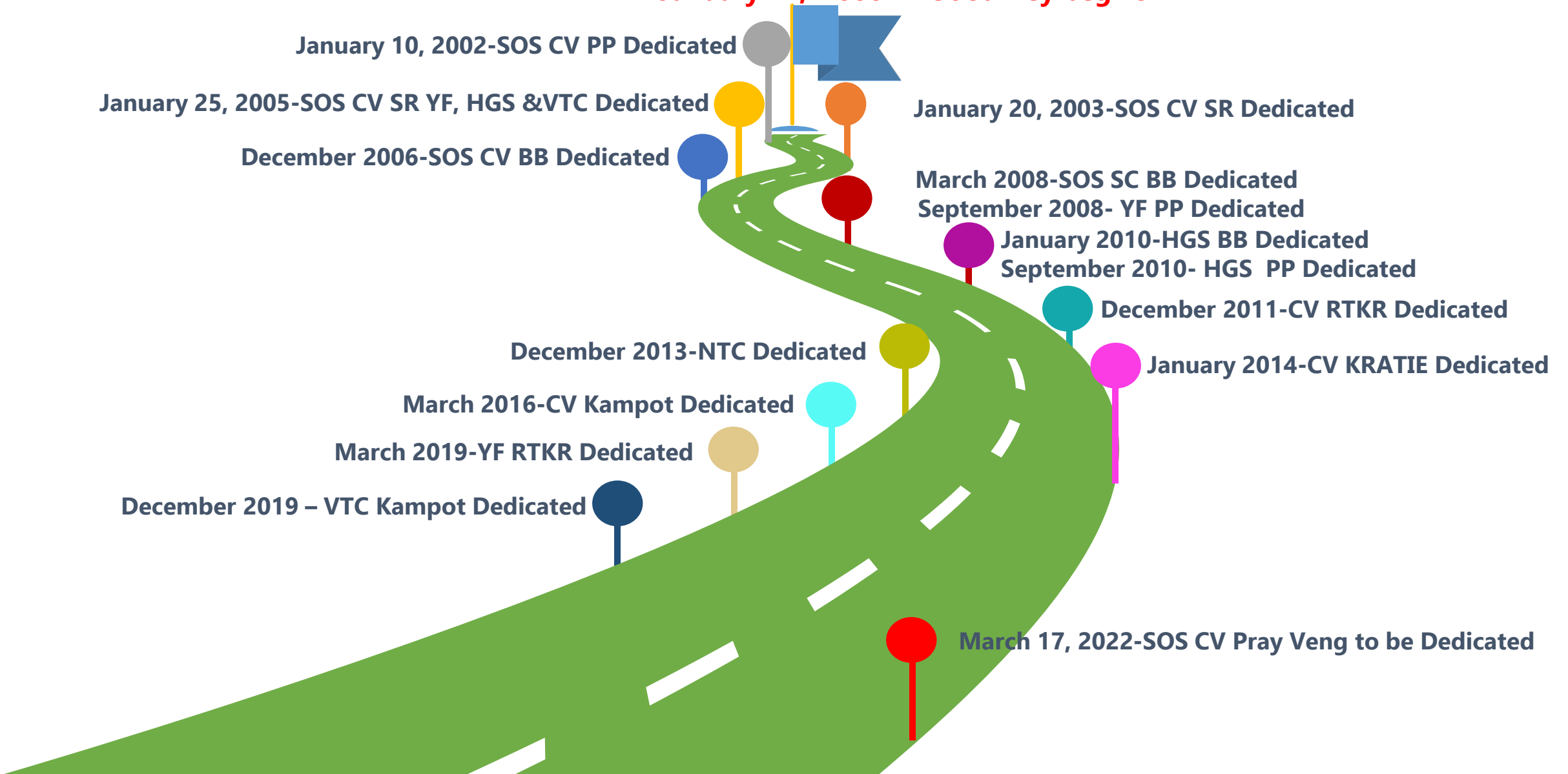

FAMILY LIKE CARE

SOS Children's Villages of Cambodia's Family Like Care Programme is an innovative and individualised care model for children who have lost their families, providing them an opportunity to grow with love, respect and security, within an SOS Family Home. Children grow up, together, as brothers and sisters under the quality care provided by an SOS Mother (a trained caregiver). The lasting bond contributes to the holistic development of the children, enables them to realise their full potential and become self-reliant. STRENTENING FAMILIES

Quite often families experiencing crisis or extreme hardship may have difficulties caring for their children. SOS Children's Villages works with families, caregivers and communities to prevent crises that can lead to child-family separation and stabilise families and their social networks so that children are better cared for and protected.



KINSHIP CARE

The Kinship Care Programme is being implemented across 3 locations. The Programme ensures that children without parental care grow up with minimal disruption to their educational, cultural and social lives. Under this initiative, children who have lost their biological parents are cared for by their extended families or relatives. Our interventions safeguard the right of every parentless child to grow up in a familiar environment by strengthening the capability and income of the extended biological families, so that they can provide proper care and education, till the child attains adulthood.

A total of **250** (female=129) children has enrolled in the programme.

EDUCATION AND YOUTH SKILLING

WE STRIVE to provide quality and value-based education to children, and support youth under our care with skilling, in order to secure productive employment for them, and make them responsible citizens. Through a variety of interventions, we promote education suited to a child's unique aptitude, capabilities and skills. Through various youth skilling and development initiatives, we equip young people with the right expertise and confidence they need to realise their potential. Development of children and youth is a crucial step in securing a sustainable future not only for them, but also for humanity.



YOUTH EMPLOYMENT

Young people who have lost or are at risk of losing parental care often find the transition from school to starting a career challenging, as they do not have the networks, resources or guidance that their peers may have access to. SOS Children's Villages, together with partners and the young people themselves.
