ABOUT CCYMCR

Cambodia Children and Young People Movement for Child Rights (CCYMCR) is an non-government, non-profit, independent, impartial, non-religious and non-political organization led by youth and a leading membership based organization for child and youth networks in Cambodia.

CCYMCR was established in 2002 and registered with Ministry of Interior in 2009. The most important role of the CCYMCR is to disseminate and monitor the implementation of the convention on the rights of the child in Cambodia.

ABOUT CCYMCR

Vision: All children in Cambodia access to their full rights as outlined in the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) and to become responsible citizens.

Mission: CCYMCR helps children to access their full rights through strengthening organization, following up and urging the duty bearers on the implementation of CRC by child and youth participation.

- 1.Children are the future of Cambodia
- 2.Child and youth led networking is the factor of positive change on CRC implementation
- 3.Transparency and accountability are to build stakeholders' confidence





CCYMCR'S NETWORKS

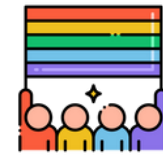
CCYMCR's network members include 16 groups/clubs which 13 groups are independent and exist 293 (190 females, 23 males, 3 non-binary) members. Beside this, in National level our closed network is Child Advocacy Network (CAN) have 248 child clubs existing about 8,000 (4000 females) children members and Adolescent Youth Reaffirmance Group (AYRG) have 914, (581 females and 9 non-binary) including 132 indigenous and 5 disability children and youths.

CCYMCR's networks are located in 18 provinces including Phnom Penh, Kandal, Takeo, Kampong Speu, Kampong Chhnang, Prey Veng, Koh Kong, Posat, Kratie, Siem Reap, Preah Vihear, Kampot, Battambang, Stoeung Treng, Ratanakiri, Tboung Khmom, Svay Rieng, and Mondolkiri.

CCYMCR have been working closely with CNCC, MOSVY, MOWA, and local authorities



SOGIESC PROJECT



Through SOGIESC project children with diverse SOGIESC are better protected and supported in their schools and communities through an increased understanding of SOGIESC rights.

This project also supported 8 activities, such as, capacity building on SOGIESC concept to children clubs, CCWCs, and community members, children lead child rights situation assessment, awareness campaign, child club monthly meeting, child club's engagement in CCWC/CIP, online campaign, and training on SHIFT 360.

Children have read children joint statement (13 recommendations) on violence against children and submitted to key ministries.

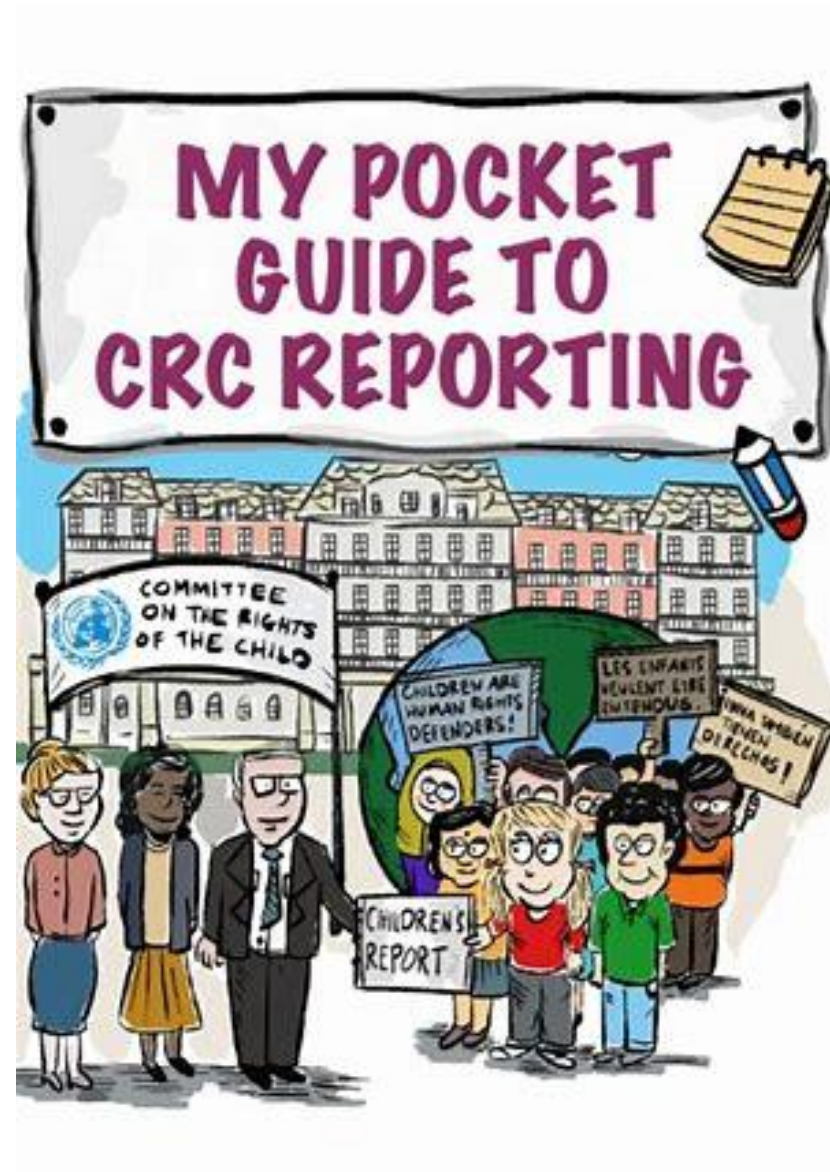
TWG Meeting on NAP EVAC 2024-2028 16th-17th October 2024
