CCC MEMBERS 283RD BI-MONTHLY MEETING ON "BUILDING STRONGER SECTOR VOICES FOR A MORE CONNECTED AND EFFECTIVE CCC NETWORK"

Introduction

As the largest membership-based organization within Cambodia with around 200 members Cooperation Committee for Cambodia (CCC) has been the secretariat of its members to monitor, coordinate and advocate to strengthen Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) by providing them with an improved enabling environment and democratic space. Member organizations comprise of diversity of sectors that contribute to the development of Cambodia.

The Cooperation Committee for Cambodia (CCC) will host its **283rd Bi-Monthly Members Meeting** on 04 August 2026 with a focus on the discussion and establishment of **sector-based member committees**, which will provide a structured platform for members with common thematic and programmatic interests to collaborate, exchange knowledge, and address sector-specific opportunities and challenges. The meeting will provide an opportunity for members to review and agree on the proposed committee structure, identify sector groupings, and discuss the roles and responsibilities of each committee, key mechanisms coordination and collective action among members to shape priorities, raise sector-specific concerns and initiatives.

In addition, there will be a presentation on (DGI) 2026, developed by the Centre for Asian Philanthropy and Society (CAPS), highlights Cambodia's performance: what Cambodia is doing well, the challenges faced, and how Cambodia can do better, linked to CSO funding situation and the collaboration among governments, donors, civil society, and the private sector. The insights from DGI provides an important evidence-based information for stakeholders to reflect on the implications of the Index, discuss challenges affecting Cambodia's social sector, and explore collective actions to strengthen the enabling environment for philanthropy, sustainable financing, and social impact. In addition, there will be a sharing from Impact Hub Phnom Penh on their valuable example of their business model and social enterprise in on CSO's capacities building, innovation for sustainable revenue-generation, diversifying funding sources, enhance resilience, and increase their long-term social impact.

The 282nd Bi-Monthly Meeting will bring together representatives from CCC member organizations, including both local and international NGOs to our networking event.

1. Introduce and discuss the proposed formation of sector-based member committees
2. Build consensus on the roles, functions, and responsibilities of the sector-based committees
3. Share key findings on the research study "2026 Doing Good Index"
4. Share Impact Hub business contribute to social development and build skill on social enterprise to CSOs in Cambodia.
