# **Do No Harm** & Conflict Sensitive Programming (DNH-CSP)

Awareness raising on Do No Harm

- DNH concept is presented in other events of CCC
- **DNH** training material is developed for distribution

Do No Harm Training of Trainers Course for 5 days

- 2 senior management staffs per each NGO In total, there are
- 25 participants Training fee is 250\$ per person for 5

Application Workshop for 5 days for each

- After ToT training. the staff from each NGO, plus a DNHC trainer conduct an application workshop for their NGO
- Preparation meeting with each NGO Trainer fee is 1,8405 per workshop

Coaching and Mentoring for 6 days per NGO

- After the application workshop, the DNHC trainer will continue supporting each NGO in application of DNH approaches in its own context
- Trainer fee is 1,380\$ per NGO

### **Usefulness of DNH**

DNH will help participating NGOs deal with critical questions such as the following:

- How can development aid, humanitarian assistance or peacebuilding work make conflicts worse – or better – by the ways in which they operate and the choices they make?
- What are the important effects of aid work in differ ent contexts – and what are the effects of the context on the aid work?
- What are some practical methods for incorporating conflict sensitivity into context analysis, and then into program design, implementation, monitor ing and evaluation?
- How can conflict sensitivity efforts be effectively moni tored and evaluated, in ways that promote robust accountability and learn ing at all levels, from providers to local commu nities to organizational headquarters and donors?



### What is DNH?

DNH is a predictable approach aimed at better understanding how aid interacts with conflict dynamics. DNH increases the application of conflict sensitivity in aid policy and practice, in order that projects minimize negative impacts and maximize positive impacts.

## **Do No Harm Trainers**

DNH Trainers source from the Do No Harm Cambodia (DNHC) Team who are expert in Do No Harm approaches. Currently DNHC team consists of 18 members from CCC, Cord Cambodia, KCD, Mission Alliance, VBNK, WPM, ACT, ForumSyd Cambodia and other professional consultants.
